Tuesday, 5th April

Opening Session **Keynote address by the Hon Thandi Shongwe, Minister for Tourism, Environment and Communications**

Session One: **The Components of Cyberlaw : An Overview**

A tutorial session that will introduce and discuss the major components of Cyberlaw including: jurisdictions, contracts, security, privacy, intellectual property, consumer protection, content liability and cybercrime.

Session Two: **Work-shop: Issues and Concerns of Cyberlaw and Possible Solutions**

An interactive session that will take an in depth look at the many issues and concerns faced by legislators when formulating and implementing Cyberlaw as well as possible solutions. The session will seek to elicit input from delegates as well as open discussion.

Wednesday, 6th April

Session Three: **The Status of Cyberlaw within SADC: Presentations of Cyberlaw Enactments and Trends.**

Session Four: **European Union experiences in harmonising cyberlaws**

A tutorial session that will draw from the processes, experiences and lessons learnt from the European Union's harmonisation of its member states' Cyberlaws.

Thursday, 7th April

Session Five: **Towards SADC Harmonisation: Feasibility and Conjecture**

A discussion led by a panel of regional experts and guest speaker presentations on the possibilities, opportunities and way forward for SADC Cyberlaw harmonisation.

Session Six: **Networking**

The afternoon is an opportunity for delegates to network informally with a view to encouraging the exchange of experiences and to strengthening regional networking.

Friday, 8th April

Session Seven: **Interactive Work Groups: Concrete steps and implications at a national level.**

A round-tables session. Delegates will be placed into workgroups allowing them to formalize, based on the previous days' experiences, recommendations for national action and support for a harmonized Cyberlaw in the SADC region.

Summary and Closure

The results of the workshop will be summarised and discussed by a panel of regional experts, followed by workshop closure.
